Lead Creative Schools

We have been incredibly fortunate to secure funding for the Lead Creative Schools Scheme, funded by the Arts Council of Wales.

This is an enquiry-led approach, whereby a teacher will work with Creative Professionals over two separate projects to co-construct creative and authentic learning experiences which align with the Four Purposes of the Curriculum for Wales and engage the Creative Habits of Mind.

Our second project is going to be undertaken by Gemma Mann, who will be working alongside a creative practitioner - interviews have taken place this week!

Their enquiry is:

"Can working with a creative partner develop authentic learning opportunities within our school to support a more holistic curriculum approach; encourage our Year 5 & Year 6 learners to develop appreciation of our local area, inspire an imaginative, inquisitive approach to learning and increase attendance through making school "the place to be"?"

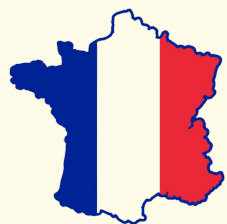

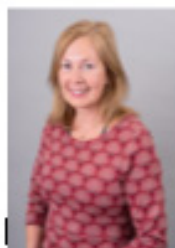
